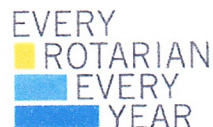

3. Briefly describe the grant and list any changes that might have occurred: (100 words or less) **The City of North Platte revitalizing an empty lot of land in the downtown. The area will become a downtown park. The suggested name of the park is the "Keith Blackledge Park. Mr. Blackledge was not only the editor of our newspaper for 25 years he was also a member of Rotary until shortly before his death in 2010. This park is also adjacent to the parking lot in which our Rotary clock is installed. This project has been in the works for several years and the city raising funds for the completion of the park. North Platte Noon Rotary provided 10 trees/scrubs for the park.**

Provide a brief of lessons learned in implementing this grant and how this will improve future grant funded projects: (100 words or less) **This grant was challenging because implementation was dependent on actions of others outside Rotary control. Causing additional delays was excessive rain and snow that prevented city workers from installing infrastructure and brick pavers. As a result, the project took almost two years rather than the anticipated four months. As a result of the delay, the Club lost track of the project. For future grants, we need to anticipate delays and establish a process for consistently updating the grant.**
