Project Title Partnership with UCAN

Our club collaborated with UCAN on four projects this year. The first was the UCAN holiday Gift Drive where three of our Rotarians purchased toys and other children's gifts with a total value of \$987.65. Second, three of our club members marched in the UCAN Polar Peace March to raise money for UCAN's peace initiatives. Third, three Rotarians volunteered to support UCAN during their 150th celebration, volunteering alongside the organization's staff team. Fourth, one of our members participated in the UCAN connection with communities of color networking event.

Approximately 30 directly through our gift giving program. For the other volunteer activities indicated, it is difficult to assign a number.

The goal of attending the peace march and assisting with the other volunteer activities was to maintain awareness of the need for peace initiatives in Chicago, and reaffirm that the community supports these efforts.
