Rotary Club of Townsend Rotary District Grant Application Narrative and Budget For American Legion Post #42 Roof Extension Project

The American Legion has been fighting several issues over the years in the rear of the building. The roof runoff has created problems with drainage towards the rear of the building. To resolve the problem, the Legion has been fundraising for several years to build an addition in the back of the building to increase storage space for the use of the Legion to better serve Broadwater County Veterans. They have raised \$12,000 to date. An existing storage shed that is contributing to the drainage problems would be removed. The roof extension from the new addition would allow for gutters to help direct runoff away from the building. This rear extension would improve the looks of the building from the rear alley. The \$1,000 from Rotary District 5390 would help complete the fundraising efforts for the \$17,000 project so it could be completed this summer 2019.
