The City of Santa Fe Springs Family & Human Services Staff seen a need by local youth and their families for school supplies and started the back to School Backpack program for financially disadvantaged students. For the past several years our Rotary Club worked with the City of Santa Fe Springs in a effort to reach more Families in need. With this partnership we are able to supply over 200 Backpacks with the Rotary Logo silk screened on them. All Backpacks are filled with school supplies.

11 Rotarians participated at different times.

Rotarians helped in purchasing supplies.

Rotarians worked with the Vendor in regards to having the Rotary Logo Silk Screened onto the Backpacks.

Rotarians gathered together to pack the backpacks with School supplies.

Rotarians all met with the City staff at the Gus Velasco Community Center to distribute backpacks to the qualified students.

Any additional backpacks will be distributed throughout the School year.

There were 180 disadvantaged youth that benefited from this project.

Local Children who benefit from this program can be expected to have greater confidence and do better in School as they have the necessary supplies to do so. In total better success in School should benefit the children and their families for many years to come.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Our Rotary Club had the opportunity to work with the City of Santa Fe Springs, Family and Human Services Division.

Their Contribution is as follows.

Designed flyers and distribute.

Case workers screened families that signed up for the Backpack program.

City staff called and sent out reminder flyers.

Case managers handled the check in desk to check to see that they were preregistered.
