Project Title Buddy Bench\_\_\_


Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? List any changes that might have occurred.

The concept behind the Buddy Bench, also called the Friendship Bench, is a simple idea to eliminate loneliness and foster friendship on the playground. Our project will be in partnership with our Homewood Rotary and interact clubs and the Homewood school district to purchase an install a buddy bench at one of our local elementary schools.

More than 200 students will benefit at Churchill school once the Buddy Bench is installed this fall. Because of the shutdown of local schools due to the COVID-19 pandemic this project has been delayed until the schools re-open.
