Partnering with Corazon, we will build a home in a day for a family in one of two communities 20km south of Tecate.

The beneficiary includes:

1. The family will now own a home with a sanitation component including a flushable toilet.

2. The community- building community with mutual support, education and security.

Construction projects ensure children and their families have a safe, secure home to live in. Corazon is empowering communities to build, repair and maintain their homes through training and job skill development. Corazon works with families earning the ability to own a home. This includes the families participation in Community service in helping other families in the area, education in various topics including money managements and job skills. Once the family has completed the pre-requisites and has been able to secure a viable site, Corazon provides the materials and man-power to build a home in a day.

Corazon has offices based in the United States. We will write the check to them and they will purchase the supplies needed for the build. Materials are purchased in Mexico to help their economy and make transport across the border easier.
