Project Description. What was done in 110 words or less?

Original project involved a cooking competition in which the Agriculture and Culinary Arts Programs of Payson High School would participate with the local Rotary club and community. A date was set and then the Coronavirus closed school through the end of the year. Social distancing was mandated and competition had to be cancelled. Rim Rotary worked with the Culinary Arts Director and found out that the Culinary Arts kitchen and work area needed remodeled. We also found out that the Agriculture group needed the equipment for their projects as well so we decided to purchase both commercial grills, grilling accessories, covers, tool sets, and microwaves so they would have the equipment when school began to use for all these projects as they were unfunded without us.
