HARLEM HEALS is a vibrant community project showcasing true Service Above Self. In response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak plaguing the entire world this project generated immediate emergency funding and support to supply the Harlem chapter of the Salvation Army. The project engaged the Harlem, New York community via health awareness, food distributions, emergency supplies (protective masks and hand sanitizer) for Salvation Army staff, provided essentials for seniors and the homeless within the community.

The beneficiaries were the homeless, elderly, and Salvation Army staff. The most vulnerable individuals within the community were provided with meals and the Salvation Army staff were provided with essential supplies for protection. During this global pandemic health, hygiene, and fighting hunger were met via this project.

Due to the COVID-19 social distancing protocol the bulk of interactions were limited. However, members have been on the frontlines serving meals to the homeless and elderly. The project ultimately helped keep the doors of the Salvation Army opened, stocked and able to distribute to those most in need in an extremely vulnerable community.

Jim Kushner from the Rotary Club of Inwood has volunteered his expertise and on site disaster skills to assist in deliveries of food to elderly who have been the most vulnerable during the pandemic.


