Project Title: Interact and KCDC Book Night

Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place?

Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

The Kemmerer Interact students created an event to promote reading and service to our younger students in our community by taking the time to read service books the local Kemmerer Child Development Center (KCDC) students. KCDC serves just over 90 students, many of whom are low income, under privileged, and/or students who require early intervention services.

The Interact Club read service books to the KCDC preschool students and then gifted each KCDC student a book to take home. This meant after the event, each KCDC student had a book at home that someone had read to them. One they can continue to enjoy.

The Interact Club was able to also provide a free meal to these students and their families. The local high school let the Interact Club use the kitchen and the lunch room to prepare and cook the taco bar for this event for free. The Interact students were able to box up the leftover and send them home with some of the lower income families to help provide another meal for them.

The Oyster Ridge BOCES was going to offer a parenting class at this same event to enlighten parents while the Interact students read to the KCDC students. However, after conversations with KCDC and Interact, it was decided that it would be better to have this time for the KCDC students to be with their parents. Instead it was decided to have Kaylynn See talk about the importance of books and our Interact President Nick Carlson talked to the families about Interact and the importance of service in our community.

2. How many Rotarians/Interact participated in this project? 2 Rotarians, 15 Interact Students

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

The two Rotarians supervised the entire event to provide leadership and guidance when needed with the Interact group. The Rotarians ensured the safety and proper food handling techniques were used in the food preparation. We also had another Rotarian show up that had students in KCDC, and they were very impressed with the event.

The Interact students cooked the food for the taco bar and maintained the food line while everyone was getting their plates. After everyone was done eating some of the Interact students cleaned up the tables and started washing dishes. While the other Interact students picked out a service book to read to the children. After the Interact students read their service books to the KCDC students, many of them went ahead and read another book to the kids! Then all the Interact students helped clean up the school cafeteria, because we were able to use the space for free we wanted it to be clean when we left it.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

There are really three groups that benefited greatly from this event, the KCDC students the Interact students, and the families that attended this great event. The KCDC students were able to come to a night that was all about them. The KDCD students also got to pick their very own book to take home and they were able to have an "older cool kid" read to them. Our Interact students were so good with all the little KCDC students and really showed them what service is about. The Interact students truly were humbled by the KDCD students, who were so grateful for their own book and to be able to take it home with them. The joy of reading that our Interact students brought to the KCDC students will be with them for a long time to come.

While everyone was eating we were able to bring in Kaylynn See who is a local Usborn books provider, and she talked for 30 minutes about the importance of reading in the home and what parents can do to help encourage their students to read.

The Kemmerer Child Development Center (KCDC) worked with the Interact Club to organize this amazing event for the KCDC students. KCDC did all of the advertising for us and they provided staff at the event to help with the students and to make sure that all the KCDC students received their book.

9. Please explain any variance of more than 5% between the budgeted amount and the actual amount including the reason for the variance and why the alternative was chosen.

There is a variance between the budgeted amount and the actual amount, because when we were budgeting for this event we were planning on the grant being for \$900.00 total. However, when we found out the grant was only \$600.00 (a \$300.00 match) we were worried we would not have enough money to pull off this event. Instead of cutting back on the event and not buying each KCDC student a book we decided to look for additional funding to help make sure this event was a success. We also planned on feeding 90 students plus their families (180 people). This would have been the best case scenario, and we wanted to make sure we would have enough money if this was the case. We were also given a much better deal on the books than we had budgeted for, because of what our group was trying to do; spread the love of reading and service.

In our proposed budget we had that we would be getting additional funding from HRC (\$200) and KCDC (\$100.00). However, both organizations said they would help us when we thought we were short on funds. Since we were able to get some discounts and shop wisely. We did not think it was right to seek out this additional funding that we did not end up needing.

Moving forward we have a better understanding of what we need to do and that we need to be clear on how much the grant is before we start budgeting!

This event was put on Facebook and a flyer was sent out to all the KCDC students' parents. There was also posters at KCDC for the parents to read. Also, Kemmerer Rotary included this project on their weekly COG.
