Project Title: The Wellness Garden at May Park	

Project Description: May Park is close to senior, disabled, low-income and young-family housing. It is the perfect setting for an innovative park designed to encourage quiet enjoyment of the natural setting for our diverse community. The Wellness Garden is designed to ensure and enhance accessibility for the inclusion of older adults and people of all ages and abilities. It includes native plants, an exercise meadow, walking paths, exercise stations, picnic area, shelters, fencing, a labyrinth, and water features. The estimated total cost is \$500,000.00. We provided \$2,000.00 (with a \$1,000.00 match from the District) to devlope pamphlets, bulletin boards, marketing materials, landscaping/benches, and general needs for the Park. We were originally going to contribute our service hours to assist in this marketing at informational booths and presentations, but COVID shut down most of our town for a very long time. We, eventually, were able to provide our community service hours by picking up trash for 10 hours (10 members at 1 hour each) this last Spring.
