3. Briefly describe your project (who did what, when and where did project activities take place?) in 100 words or less.

The objective of the project was to inspire low-income fifth and sixth grade students to graduate and pursue post high school educations by equipping them with life skills and building their self-esteem. The youth attended life skills classes taught by school teachers and YMCA instructors. To facilitate participation, most activities took place at schools over the lunch period. Community service projects occurred in the students' neighborhoods.

Leadership camps were canceled due to COVID19 precautions. Leadership classes and community service projects were canceled in the fall semester of 2020/21. A remote learning curriculum enabled initiation of classes of the spring semester of 2020/21. In 2021/22, leadership classes and community service projects were completed as planned.

4. In one brief sentence: who were the beneficiaries of the grant activities and how many of them were there?

Beneficiaries were 107 low-income fifth and sixth grade students attending three Title I schools in the 2020/2021 school year, and 190 low-income fifth and sixth grade students attending seven Title I schools in the 2021/22 school year.

5. How many Rotarians participated in the project? Briefly tell what did.
Approximately 40 Rotarians participated.
 - **Teams of Rotarians met with the youth during the 2021/22 school year to discuss what they were learning and how they were applying these new skills in their lives. They obtained students' reviews of the program.**
 - **Rotarians built "Buddy Benches" and installed them at the schools.**
 - **Rotarians contributed financially.**

- Rotarians coordinated the involvement of collaborators in the project.

6. If a cooperating organization(s) other than the beneficiary was involved, what was its role?

Participating Schools and the Boise School District contributed teachers and counselors to serve as instructors. They allowed time during the school day for Everyday Leadership classes. They assisted in providing transportation to off-campus events. They assisted in assessing outcomes from the program. They assisted in negotiating through COVID requirements.

The Treasure Valley YMCA provided an instructor for Morley Nelson Elementary School. They provided activities and games that illustrated the leadership skills. They maintained the curriculum for the program and provided their facilities for events.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southwest Idaho provided volunteer mentors for students at Taft Elementary School. This was a trial endeavor that that could be expanded to other participating schools.
