Project Description:

2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place?
Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?
We partnered with the Casper Senior Center to purchase tables and chairs to replace the deteriorated ones in the dining room. When the chairs arrived at the Senior Center one Reveille Rotarian checked them out to determine what tools we would need. On a designated night we met in the Senior Center dining room armed with electric screw drivers, wrenches, scissors, and sharp knives to unpack then assemble the chairs. We collected the packing material and recycled it. About two hours later we were done and enjoyed some time together, properly distanced and masked. Two days later, two non-profits loaded up the old chairs and took them away. About a month later the tables arrived and we followed the same process. The exception was that only a few of the old tables found homes that night. There are still some to be recycled once we can do so safely with Covid-19. Because of the virus we were not able to involve the beneficiaries or other community members, except for a spouse and a friend of the Rotarians involved. Most of the beneficiaries are in the high-risk group, being seniors.

We assembled all the chairs and tables. We recycled the packing material. We donated the old chairs to two non-profit organizations that could use them.
