The Rotary Club of Windsor under the inspiration of long time Rotarian, Ron Clark, installed 12 Little Free Libraries around the Windsor and Severance Communities. The club paid for the libraries to be build, found stewards for each one, stocked them with books primarily for kids to increase literacy, and continues to maintain them.
