1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Malaika Orphanage Children Foundation is a home to 219 kiddos, Orphans, Disabled and HIV infected children. The home lacks access to sufficient and sustainable supply of energy having so many blackouts in a week making it impossible for the children to do their homework hence affecting their education score. There's no way to preserve the children's milk and food. Children digesting left out food get sick periodically and it's very expensive to pay for the electricity bill, which money can be used to provide other children's needs for example tuition, school supplies to mention but a few.

The purchase of the panels was done by the Rotary Club of Bwebajja and installation was completed by S. L Enterprises on the 15th day of January, 2021 at Malaika Orphanage Children Foundation Home and 219 Orphans will be the beneficiaries from this project
