Field Trip No. 1: [Homer Public Library](#)



Date: Dec. 2, 2021

Field Trip No. 2: Homer Harbor, Kachemak Bay Branch College, Homer Family Theater



Date: February 24th, 2022

Number of students participating/their ages: 7 children, 2nd-11th grades

Purpose/Outcome: Visited Homer Harbor and met Aaron Glidden, Homer City Operations Officer, and Shelby & William Carlson who live aboard the M/V Trana. Students got to discuss city and harbor operations and life aboard a boat in the harbor in the winter. We also saw some harbor seals.

Students toured the local college facilities and were able to ask questions of the college guidance counselor. They sat through a "lecture" on classroom engagement and learning.

At the theater, we watched *Indiana Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Ark*. It was the first time most of our students had ever been to a movie theater.

Field Trip No. 3: Wynn Nature Center



Date: March 18, 2022

Number of students participating/their ages: 6 children, K-11th grades

Purpose/Outcome: Students snowshoed through the Wynn Nature Center, looking for signs of animal habitation and vegetable growth/regrowth. We also visited a snow accumulation measurement area and a sound recording station. Students practiced measuring snow depth and learned how snow accumulation affects fresh water supply at the Homer Reservoir and learned about the International Arctic Soundscapes Project in which the Wynn is participating.

Students were particularly interested in the behavior of sea birds and their nesting habitats. Also, they found and rescued a stranded rockfish.
