wi ric le or Th	roject Description: An adaptive tricycle/bike is designed for children with physical disabilities that II not allow them to ride a traditional bike. The bike has several great features to ensure the safety of the der. The adaptive bicycle features a full seat where the ride can be fully secured and strapped in, self-veling pedals with straps, and rear handle for the caregiver to assist with steering and pushing. Transfers and off the bike are easier because the adaptive bike has a low step, flip-away handlebar. The health benefits include lower extremity strengthening, reciprocal leg motion patterning, balancing cills, using visual, spatial perception for steering, and increased social interaction.

An adaptive tricycle/bike is designed for children with physical disabilities that will not allow them to ride a traditional bike. The health benefits include lower extremity strengthening, reciprocal leg motion patterning, balancing skills, using visual, spatial perception for steering, and increased social interaction.

Club Members, Beneficiaries and Community Involvement

Each beneficiary was measured by a local Physical Therapist to get their own custom made bike. The bikes were made by the Rifton company. The bikes do not come assembled; therefore, club members assisted with assembling the bikes. A local fire department volunteered to help the club members with the assembly to ensure that the assembly was done correctly. Club members also assisted with giving the bikes out to the beneficiaries. The bikes were given out in a small group setting, so that the caregivers could be trained how to transfer the child, properly strap them in, and how to steer and use the bike. This was done in different giveaway sessions with club member involved to get the bikes delivered and the caregivers trained. A local fire department allowed us to us their training facility to store the bikes until assembly and giveaway day. The fire station had a large indoor facility were the assembly could be done and the beneficiaries could ride the bikes around in a safe area.
