

Problem Identification

- •81 % of Nepali people live in rural areas.
- With rural areas not able to provide enough opportunities for people to sustain their lives, the burden of supporting the poor and rural population falls increasingly upon cities.
- The migration of rural men to urban areas & abroad leaves unbalanced family structures behind, with women, children and elderly expecting remittances.
- Lack of proper income & depending upon men for income have brought problem in family. Not able to invest in food, education & health.
- Rise in women violence & gender disparity due to financial reason.
- Local resources are wasted for nothing.
- Market is waiting for rural product due to organic nature.



Program Goal: To contribute to poverty reduction through entrepreneurship development—with a focus on rural development and gender equality.

The essential elements in this programme are to create a business environment that encourages the initiatives of rural and women entrepreneurs and to enhance the human and institutional capacities required to foster entrepreneurial dynamism and enhance productivity.



Approach

Micro- and small-scale enterprises (MSE) are affordable and manageable by rural people. They create a large number of non-farm employment and income opportunities in relatively poorly developed areas and require small capital and little sophisticated managerial and technical skills.

All the women related livelihood program will be register locally as small scale enterprises & Will be trained professionally .



Proposed Activities

1.Pickle Industry: Pickles are popular among Asians and each country and region has its own traditions and methods to make them. They serve as a flavor enhancer and they are typically eaten in small pieces with the rest of a meal. There are a wide variety of pickles and each is usually made with a mixture of fruits or vegetables that are chopped and marinated in oil or juice and a variety of spices, including chili pepper and salt. Good pickle have always high demand.

Location: Danuwar village of Pachakal Municipality (Have lot of raw materials)

Number of people engage: 15-20 unemployed, underprivileged women & disable

Production: 16 varieties of pickle

Duck meat demand is increasing but the supply hasn't able to meet it. Duck is farm near to pond or river side. And it needs less investment and less care compare to others.

Location: Selected village of Panauti Municipality (near river side)

Rabbit Farming: Rabbit Farming is emerging business in Nepal. There is a great opportunity of rabbit farming, and commercial production can be a great source of income and employment. Rabbits need small place for living and less food for surviving. Rabbit meat contains high ratio of protein, energy, calcium and vitamin than any other types of animal meat. The amount of cholesterol, fat and sodium is also less than other meat.
