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NEED OF THE PROJECT TO THE COMMUNITY

Over 800 children study at Ganjad Ashramshala Co-educational Adivasi School. The school has the capacity to house 400 children with limited living



facilities. The remaining children walk several kilometres each day from nearby villages, to attend school.

Narrow potholed roads turning into a gravelled pathway, lead up to the school.

The compound comprises a few single-storey buildings that house

small classrooms which double up as dormitories after class. Toilets few in numbers remotely located causes are pertinent problem for this girls specially after dusk.

RCBA in an endeavour to promote GIRLS education, proposes to set up comfortable facilities for these girls with proper hygiene facilities.

SUSTAINABILITY

Ashramshala (Residential School) for Adivasi (Tribal) children at Ganjad was established in 1989 and managed by Shikshan Prasarak Mandal Trust.

The cost of Principal, teachers and staff and food is provided by the Ministry of Tribal Welfare, Government of Maharashtra.

However, no provisions are made for infrastructure, amenities and basic other necessities.

The Trust has successfully managed provide free education to over 800 children each year with a committed faculty of 15 teachers and 10 support staff who undertake primary teaching from Grade I to secondary education upto Grade X.

The rooms are lined with the children's meagre possessions, with no place else for storage. These contain their bare essentials, sad testimony to their premature acceptance of fate.

Several structures the in compound have crumbling roofs, urgent need of repair. Illequipped kitchens, ilapidated toilets are amongst many Unhygienic conditions that



urgently need to be rectified.

The children are forced to use the toilets as per an allotted schedule, rather than on a need basis. The brokendown condition scares the younger children against using the toilets at night.





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This project is challenging and demanding.

PROPOSAL

A phase wise project is planned to provide these children with state of the art facilities which promote and fulfil their thirst of education.

This phase is planned to encompass a two-storeyed girl's residential hostel, capable of housing 200 girls. The hostel will be well appointed with bunk beds, toilets and bathrooms running hot water heated with solar water heaters. Covered balconies and terraces will be used for group and study activities.
