There are technologies that have proven their versatility, reliability and cost-benefit, hydrogen peroxide (plasma) systems, are new technologies that decrease times in the sterilization process, are very reliable and no special facilities are required because they do not represent a health risk for the people who carry out the process because they do not consider themselves toxic. These characteristics have displaced previous technologies such as sterilization of ethylene oxide (toxic, more time sterilization and requires special installations). However, since 100% of surgical equipment and instruments cannot be sterilized in these new technologies, sterilizers with other conventional technologies (steam, ethylene oxide) must be available.
