This letter is to indicate that the County of San Diego Tuberculosis Control Program will gladly participate with the Tijuana Independencia Rotary and the San Diego Downtown Breakfast Rotary in your Rotary matching grant project to augment the binational tuberculosis control efforts of the Puentes de Esperanza project.

The San Diego County Tuberculosis Control Program is the principal lead on the Puentes de Esperanza project. Our office along with the UC San Francisco affiliated Curry Center will organize the binational workshops on treatment of multi-drug resistant tuberculosis with support from Rotary. We will link Rotary to Project Concern International, a non-governmental organization in Tijuana that provides community support for the Tijuana Health Jurisdiction's Tuberculosis Control Program to arrange for purchase of patient incentives. We will work with Rotary to purchase N-95 protective masks for community health workers in Tijuana and provide training and fit-testing to the workers in concert with the Tijuana Health Jurisdiction and Tijuana General Hospital. We will also work with Rotary and Channel 12 to produce public service announcements in Tijuana on tuberculosis and Puentes de Esperanza.

We agree to cooperate with any financial review of the project done by Rotary International.
