#### 2. Briefly describe the project, its location and its objectives.

The H Diamond W Youth Camp (H<>W) was formed to provide a location and facilities that can be used by youth groups. The main activity of H<>W is to provide an outdoor camp area to foster, promote, assist and encourage the physical, mental and social development of youth in any and all ways, including the sponsorship and conduct of youth camps and educational programs. The camp and main lodge built in 1963 includes a kitchen, dining hall, bathroom facilities, running water, limited electrical services and an area for campers, tents and RVs. It is located in an area called Grass Creek, WY, which is in northwestern Hot Springs County, WY. It is approximately 65 miles west of Thermopolis WY and approximately 3 miles from the Shoshone National Forest Boundary. Presently, the use of H<>W camp facilities is used by 4-H, Church and School groups from the four Northwestern Wyoming counties, (Hot Springs, Washakie, Park and Big Horn).

A couple years ago, the camp directors embarked on a plan to improve the facilities by building some cabins to provide sleeping facilities for youth and adult leaders, improvements to restroom facilities and other facilities that would improve safety and allow for more diverse youth activities. Improvements are also planned to improve ADA accessibility within the camp and improve safety for the youth. To date, three cabins have been built and a planned forth cabin will be built this summer. Each cabin sleeps 10 - 12 youth. Funding for H<>W has been through fees collected from the use of the camp, donations, fundraising and small grants. H<>W is a tax exempt organization under Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(3).

Here is where the Thermopolis Rotary Club fits into the picture. The camp directors are ready to construct an "outhouse" near the new cabins. It is a matter of safety. The camp in located in bear country and the newly constructed cabins are a distance from the main bathroom facilities. The new outhouse would allow the youth to use a close restroom facility (especially in the middle of the night) rather than making the long walk up to the existing facilities. It is important to note that the directors plan to continue adding cabins to this area as funding permits.

### B Describe how the project will benefit the community and/or improve the lives of the less fortunate. Also indicate the number of people that will benefit by this project.

As cabins and the planned outhouse are added, the goal of the H<>W is to improve the youth camp so that it can increase participation in activities that will foster, promote, assist and encourage the physical, mental and social development of youth. Camp directors estimate 11,600 youth in the four counties that would be the target population in the immediate area.

# 4. Describe the nonfinancial participation by sponsoring Club Rotarians in the project (i.e., How many Rotarians will be involved and what will they do).

The main building, improvements and upkeep has been done with money raised from mainly Hot Springs and Washakie counties. The camp also relies totally on volunteer board members, youth and adult volunteers. At least half of our Thermopolis Rotary club membership has been involved in volunteering for the camp in the past and I would expect that to continue in the future.

#### Are other Rotarians, either local or international going to be involved in the project?

We would welcome involvement from out of town Rotarians. We would also be willing to share our project with other Rotarian clubs wishing to embark on a similar venture.

The H<>W directors are very good at publicizing the camp improvements. They also told our Rotary club they would put a nice plaque on the completed outhouse. They are excited to have our assistance. Also, our Thermopolis Rotary Club also has a great publicity chairperson (who is our President) Shurie Scheel. She will make sure the media is contacted and publishes our involvement.
