#### 2 . Briefly describe the project, its location and its objectives.

A group of passionate volunteers have elected to start a backpack program in conjunction with our local school system. A current volunteer group named the People for People program, provides meals, for the elderly and persons in need, every Sunday. The organization is a 501(c)(3) entity and is staffed entirely by volunteers. This group has seen the need for a children's backpack program in our community and is embarking on this new adventure. The group approached our Thermopolis Rotary Club because they knew this was a program that our Rotary Club has been "kicking around" for a few months.

# 3 . Describe how the project will benefit the community and/or improve the lives of the less fortunate. Also indicate the number of people that will benefit by this project.

The Backpack program is designed to feed elementary school children whose families qualify for the federal free and reduced meal program and have little or no food on the weekends. Therefore, the families of the elementary school children receiving the food qualify as poverty level under the federal guidelines. The goal is to stop hunger, create better test scores, improve reading skills, encourage positive behavior, improve health and increase school attendance. Every Friday, elementary students will receive their backpacks filled with food items that require little to no preparation. They will return their backpacks on Monday ready to learn. The backpacks will contain enough servings of easily prepared food to feed the child for the entire weekend.

As far as the number of people that will benefit by this project, the initial estimate is 100 children. However, that number is probably low. If it is known that there are other siblings in the household, extra food will be sent home to feed the additional siblings in the family.

# 4. Describe the nonfinancial participation by sponsoring Club Rotarians in the project (i.e., How many Rotarians will be involved and what will they do).

As mentioned in #2, above the committee approached our Rotary Club because they knew we are very interested in the project. The Thermopolis Rotary has discussed the volunteer commitment to helping gather the food supplies and getting them to the schools on Fridays. Our club has also discussed future fundraising ideas to sustain the program. Ideas included having Rotarians "adopt a child" for the school year. That would mean a Rotarian would fund the cost of a child in the backpack program for a school year. That cost is estimated to be around \$300 - \$350 per child per year.

Our Rotary club membership usually runs around 30 to 35 members. Judging from the interest, I would anticipate that at least 20 to 25 of our members would participate in some way with this program. They would either commit funds to the project, adopt a child for the school year or commit their time to help gather food supplies or fill the backpacks. Our club is aware that this grant will only cover the first year of operation but we do not view this as a one year project. It will be ongoing. Our club is a very generous club; generous with their time and their resources. Therefore support will be needed from our club and the community for the subsequent years to keep the program going. We do not anticipate any problems with this.

Are other Rotarians, either local or international going to be involved in the project?

We would welcome involvement from out of town Rotarians. We would also be willing to share our project with other Rotarian clubs wishing to embark on a similar venture.

5. How will the general public know this is a Rotary-Sponsored project? Please provide details of the publicity plan.

The current People for People program is widely known throughout our community and as the group embarks on their new adventure, they will publicize our Rotary Clubs participation in the program. They are excited to have our assistance. Our Rotary Club also has a great publicity chairperson (who is our President Elect) Shurie Scheel. She will make sure the media is contacted and publishes the new backpack program for our community. Another great way to allow others to donate to the program is to set up donation boxes at the local grocery stores. Rotary could assist with these donation boxes and have constant publicity on them.

Students receive backpacks on Friday containing enough servings of easily prepared food to feed 1 child for the ENTIRE Weekend (7 meals).

Please Note: Our Thermopolis Rotary Club is partnering with a group of passionate volunteers to start a backpack program for our local elementary school children. Every Friday, eligible elementary students will receive their backpacks filled with food items that require little to no preparation. The backpacks will contain enough servings of easily prepared food to feed the child for the entire weekend.

The Backpack program is designed to feed elementary school children whose families qualify for the federal free and reduced meal program and have little to no food on the weekend. Therefore, the families of the elementary school children receiving the food qualify as poverty level under the federal guidelines.

The entire budgeted amount above will be spent on FOOD. There are no administrative costs. All other services and costs are volunteered or donated.

Food will be purchased locally and from the Wyoming Food Bank of the Rockies.

We are volunteer members of the People for People Backpack program; a local group of volunteers that provides meals for children on the weekends, during the school year. We are a non-profit organization, operating under the Episcopal Churches 501(3) c. We do fundraising to pay for the food we prepare.

The People for People Backpack Program is designed to feed school children whose families qualify for the federal Free and Reduced Meal program, and have little or no food on the weekends.

Our Goal is to STOP HUNGER. Create better test scores, improved reading skills, positive behavior, improved health and increased attendance. We know a program like this is needed in our community. We are finding that to do this program it will take about \$300.00 dollars per student per school year. Totaling approximately \$10,000 dollars a year, give or take, for just the elementary school. We will be trying to add the middle school this year which also has approximately 80 students. All funds go directly to the purchase of food ONLY. Everyone involved in this program is strictly a volunteer, and is very passionate about feeding our children. The only funds that were spent on supplies were a grant from the Thermopolis Community Fund to get totes and shelving for this purpose only.

Every Friday, students receive their backpacks with staples that require little to no preparation. The Backpacks contain enough servings of easily prepared food to feed 1 child for the entire weekend.

We began our program with Ralph Witters Elementary School last fall. We started out providing meals for 100 students. We are hopes that we will be able to expand to the middle school this school year, and eventually expand in our community and we will be able to provide needed meals in all grades.

We have partnered with the Thermopolis Rotary Club and have received some donations from a few local individuals and clubs. I believe in our community.

We are also asking for Volunteer help. We will be needing volunteers to help pick up food and fill backpacks. There are also other ways you can help. You could sponsor a child. You can donate funds, food, bags or time. If you feel you can help us please contact one of us.
