## Chamber selects executive board

Thursday evening, the Thermopolis-Hot ings Chamber of Commerce Board chose executive board officers for 2016-17. icers are President Greg Willson, Vice sident Deb Tudor, Treasurer Tracy ko and Secretary Robin Griffin. The four also authorized signers on accounts. Also presented at the meeting were board ction results. Chamber Executive Direc-Meri Ann Rush noted the election was cushion of \$5,000, the ending monthly balance is \$23,584.81. This includes: \$104.36 from the 2016 fireworks, \$242.50 from the 2015 21 Days of Christmas, -\$81.43 from the 2016 People of the Earth, \$6,914.50 from Friends of Hot Springs State Park/ Legend Rock, \$15,653.08 from the Demolition Derby and -\$4,248.20 from outstanding checks. Rush noted the billing for People of the Earth is about 2-3 months behind, and the overall budget for the fiscal year everything is ready to go for the night of the event.

Willson presented a report regardin economic development, noting the recen brownfields workshop was well attende with plenty of ideas regarding propertie that might be revitalized or cleaned up and funding sources that could be used fo such projects.

The Economic Development Compan is currently looking at what the next bi
