Brief Project Description:

Working in conjunction with the Irvine 2-11 Marine Adoption Committee and in partnership with the City of Irvine, Rotarians will work to prepare 200 "Welcome Home" and family care packages for Marines, Sailors and their families. The Club will also host a "Welcome Home" event and one other special event for families. These items maybe combined in consultation with partner organizations.

We anticipate at least 40 Rotarians will participate in the project which represents more than 50% of the Club's current membership. Rotarians will help secure additional contributions of cash and other donations to include in the Welcome Home and family care packages. Rotarian volunteers will be responsible for assembling the care packages, providing manpower for special Welcome Home events and holiday party and for increasing the public's awareness of the project and need in the community.

9. Who are the Beneficiaries:

In 2007, the City of Irvine adopted the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division (2/11 Marines), currently comprised of approximately 750 active Marine and Sailors from Camp Pendleton who bravely protect the rights and freedoms of the United States, its Allies, and people around the world. When a Marine or Sailor deploys it is the family who also sacrifices. The IRVINE 2-11 MARINE ADOPTION PROJECT - recognizes the sacrifices of both groups.
