Project Title: _ Blanket Warmer for Nursing Home_

Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

The residents were often cold and the staff had identified that a blanket warmer was needed to help the residents get warmer faster. The blanket warmer has helped heat residents up faster than a regular blanket would be able to. The blanket warmer was out of the budget of the nursing home. We purchased and ordered the blanket warmer and the maintenance department at the nursing home installed it. Then Rotary came and had lunch with the residents and did a little photo op with the warmer.

The Rotarians proposed the project, and a few got together and worked up the grant. Then, Rotarians worked with the nursing home to figure out what warmer they wanted and ordered it. Then, the warmer was delivered to the nursing home and was installed. Then, our whole Rotary Club went to the nursing home for lunch, spending time with residents, and did a dedication with the residents.

- 5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The beneficiaries of the project are the nursing home patients and long-term residents. We are helping to keep them warm! The blanket warmer can hold up to 12 blankets at a time, and is constantly being rotated out, so there is always a warm blanket available for the residents who need one! The blanket warmer is anticipated to last 10-20 years.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role? The non-profit nursing home helped choose which warmer they wanted, and their maintenance team installed it.
