## 1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The Irvine Rotary Club, working with the Club Rotario Ensenada Calafia, the Ensenada School District and Dental Care for Children travels to Ensenada twice a year to hold a one-day dental clinic for all the children in a selected school. In one day, the dental team treats 50 to 100 children, providing up to \$60,000 worth of free services. Because of Rotary's involvement, Dental Care for Children is also able to run a short clinic the evening before to benefit orphaned children or those in another underserved area.

The spring, 2014 clinic added a new volunteer optometrist (a Rotarian from a different District) who performed examinations and provided free glasses to orphans, students and family members. In addition, he left approximately 250 pairs of glasses with the Ensenada Rotary club to be used by a local optometrist who will be providing glasses free of charge to those unable to purchase them.

The project was promoted on website and Facebook pages for Irvine Rotary, Dental Care for Children, District 5320 and Ensenada Rotary.

#### 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

More than 20 Rotarians from Irvine participated in this project along with almost all of the members from Ensenada Calafia Rotary.

#### 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Members handled check-in, checkout, triage and health education. In addition, Rotarians and Rotaractors from Ensenada also helped with school maintenance and improvement projects such as painting of classrooms, grounds maintenance, etc.

#### 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

Overall, more than 165 children were treated and helped with dental care. Vision examinations were performed on 208 people and 148 pairs of glasses were dispensed. The value of all services provided was in excess of \$130,600 (reports attached).

#### 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Immediate relief of dental problems means the children are free from pain. This helps their immediate quality of life. It also means they can pay better attention in school. Training and education in dental hygiene to the students and family members provides long-term sustainability of the effort and reduces future negative impacts.

The vision program, added for the Spring, 2014 clinic makes an incredible long-term impact for children who have compromised visual acuity. Being able to see helps them in school, sports and normal day-to-day activities.

#### 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Dental Care for Children, an Irvine-based non-profit organization, provided the equipment, supplies as well as coordinating the dental professionals.
