Enhancement to Solution For Urban Agriculture's "Farm & Food Lab" on the Great Park in Irvine. The funds purchased soil amendment, soil nutrients, seeds and hand tools. We transformed 4000sf of underutilized ground, into highly productive and educational raised bed gardens. This not only allows for the hands on education of the general public and elementary school tours, but also generates an incredible amount of nutrient dense produce, for the local food bank.
