Attached below is a description from the Ensenada Rotary Club describing what they did.

First of all we hope you, your family and all Rotarians are well and healthy during these difficult times.

Again, we would very much like to thank both, the Avalon Rotary Club and San Clemente Sunrise Rotary Club for your kind support over the years on the "despensas" (food) giving for the most needed people in Ensenada.

As you know, the COVID-19 pandemia hit us hard as well and it forced us to re-think the manner in which we will be giving the food to the people this year. I would like to outline what we had agreed on:

1. We have formed 5 teams that have chosen different manners to deliver the food, considering social distancing and health measures.
2. Some temas will go to previously selected schools, which have large class rooms or small gyms, with at least two doors, one to go in and the second one to exit; the teams will prepare each space with tables, signs, tape and speakers. People will enter the class room one by one, with masks on; areas will be highly ventilated and will follow a protocol for temperature taking and sanitizing periodically.
3. If each team determines that the space is not being safe, they will be able to suspend the delivery until they feel it has become secure again and even change dates to continue delivering the food.
4. Other teams have elected to go house by house in given areas around the County; they have decided to deliver the food in one or more days.
5. The package that we will be giving will contain food and masks that meet the safety standards given by the federal health ministry, thus, helping the people to take care of themselves.

The first delivery date will be this Saturday January 31st and will go on until we give all the "food baskets". All team members and Rotarians will be taking pictures and documenting the delivery of the goods, which we will forward to you.

As soon as the pandemia allows us, we would like to invite you and your Club members to join us in the traditional "taquiza", "beer & tequila" gathering; this is a tradition that has been going on for many years and you all are part of it.
