1. Briefly describe the	e project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
	from the Rotary Club of Irvine, the Newport Irvine Rotary Club, OC Digital, Santa Ana Rotary, the 2/11 Marine family and friends joined forces on April 17 at San Leandro Park, Irvine, CA to put together 100 Welcome Home bags

The Welcome Home bags filled with full sized hygiene items, toothbrushes, toothpaste, snacks, towels and other donated items will be distributed in May to the approximate 100 troops returning back to Camp Pendleton after their deployment.

for the returning troops of the 2/11 Marines stationed at Camp Pendleton and 22 Welcome Baby Baskets for expectant Marine couples.

We filled 22 Welcome Baby Baskets with diapers, wipes, a baby carrier, an outfit, toys, booties and other baby necessities. After our event on April 17, the 2/11 Adoption Committee received news of an additional 7 couples expecting. We were able to purchase with our remaining funds the 2 strollers, diapers and outfits on the 2/11 Marine's Amazon Wish List which will be combined with other donations received from other organizations. The baskets and other donated items will be present to 30 expectant parents in May at the annual baby shower.

Due to the COVID-19, the Holiday Party scheduled for December was cancelled due to social distancing restrictions.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
- 21 Rotarians from The Rotary Club of Irvine, Newport Irvine Rotary Club, the OC Digital Rotary Club and the Santa Ana Rotary Club participated in this project.
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians selected and purchased items for the Welcome Baby Baskets and for the Welcome Home Bags. Together with other Rotary Clubs, 2/11 Committee members and their families meet to assemble the baskets and bags. These baskets and bags were then delivered/handed over to the 2/11 committee for distribution to the troops and expectant parents.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

9 non-Rotarians from the 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee and their family participated in the April 17 event. Donations collected from the Irvine Middle School YAT (Youth Action Team), Miley (Irvine Girl Scout), Nadia (Irvine High School) and Albertson (Tustin, CA) were combined with the Rotary donations. 30 Marine couples and 100 troops benefited from our project.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Both the Welcome Baby Baskets and the Welcome Home bags benefiting the 2/11 Marines at Camp Pendleton are ongoing projects of the 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee. Both The Rotary Club of Irvine and the 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee posted on their FACEBOOK pages pictures and a video of the event.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

On September 15, 2007, the City of Irvine officially adopted a Marine battalion from Camp Pendleton to make a difference in the lives of our military personnel and their families. The Irvine 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee with the Irvine community support the adopted battalion by participating and donating to a variety of activities. These activities include holiday and pre-deployment events, care packages, toy drives and more.
