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Project Title: Malayika Rescue Mission (4)

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## **Project Description**

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? Malayika Rescue Mission (MRM) supported the educational and day-to-day expenses of 47 underprivileged children in Kampala, Fort Portal and several other communities in Uganda. Normally, students attend three primary and nine secondary schools, but current enrollment until February is reduced to only 7 primary in 2 schools and 4 secondary students in 4 schools due to COVID. In Feb. full enrollment will resume at 3 elementary and 8 secondary schools. Grant monies pay a portion of school tuition expenses to include uniforms, school supplies, personal hygiene items, toiletries, medical supplies, writing paper and dictionaries. MRM staff in Uganda pay each school in cash (Uganda shillings) for portions of Fall 2020 and Winter 2021 semesters and purchased school supplies locally. The Matching Grant combined with club funds was deposited in BBVA and monies were transferred by wire from the MRM account at BBVA in Hurst, TX to Postbank Uganda Ltd. in Kampala.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 4

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Jolly Kahunde directly monitored the MRM staff of three in Uganda in administering the program on site. She communicated frequently with schools to discuss admissions, negotiate fees and check student attendance and performance. Jollie was a major contributor to MRM as well. Bill Bracken prepared the grant proposal and presented to Pacesetters Board, handled deposit to BBVA and wire transfer, donated \$500 personal funds to support the grant. Club Treasurer Reggie Parr received District funds, issued \$4,000 club check to MRM combining \$1,500 District grant with \$2,500 club funds.

4. How many Non-Rotarians participated in the project? 3

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? The long term benefits include providing a high school education to children who otherwise would not have attended school, providing enhanced job opportunities. MRM provides toiletries, personal hygiene, medicine, clothing, food and housing to improve the living standard and health of the community, focusing on girls and young women. Rotary's Areas of Focus in Basic Education and Literacy, Disease Prevention and Treatment, plus Maternal and Child Health are supported.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?  
Twelve schools that were providing education, daily meals and shelter.
