> EMERGENCY RESCUE SPONSOR

Overview: OCJ Kids provides a Trunk Kit filled with 26 Go-Kits (Diapers, Pajamas & wipes) to Arizona Department of Child Safety (DCS) workers who must remove children quickly from an abusive home. Oftentimes, the children are hungry and wearing only a soiled diaper or dirty clothes.

Levels:

> TRANSITION TO INDEPENDENCE SPONSOR

Overview: Transition to Independence is OCJ Kids' three-year program to prepare foster teens, starting at age 16, for independent living, as they are required by law to leave their foster group home when they turn 18.
