### **Project Description:**

- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

The 10 Schools project fixed all water leaks and provided various combinations of additional tanks, water filters and pumps and connected the tanks at all 10 schools to municipal water and to the schools' reticulation system. This ensures:

- 1) 10 schools in Makhanda in the Eastern Cape of South Africa have sufficient stored water to ensure secure water supply during the regular periods when municipal supply is disrupted.
- 2) This allows these schools to operate without disruption when municipal water is unavailable and so adds to a range of interventions by NGOs and Rhodes University aimed at improving education in the township schools of Makhanda.
- 3) Water filters were supplied in several schools to ensure safe drinking water as well as safe water for use in preparing the daily meal for the children under the National Nutritional Programme.

Rotarians prepared community assessment, developed detailed scope for development, liaisons with the principals and school leadership, supervised the execution of placement of tanks, pumps, and plumbing, managed payments from project account

Non Rotarians from Rhodes University, GADRA (a local NGO), and the construction trades provided detailed assistance in the development and execution of the scope of the project.

6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The primary beneficiaries at 10 schools are over 6000 students and teachers each year. The project life will be at least ten years. The school schedule was maintained through the first term although the city endured frequent water outages that previously had cased schools to close for lack of sanitation.

7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

Rhodes University outreach program helped identify the most promising schools for student achievement if they were given consistent water supply. GADRA operates an extensive and effective student support program that included quantified information on the performance of the schools
