The idea behind this project was to get the Nursing Home residents outside for fresh air during COVID and yet keep them safe by putting up a fence so that they would not wander off. We wanted to make a safe and beautiful place for the Nursing Home residents at South Lincoln Hospital Nursing Home in Kemmerer, Wyoming. The main focus for this project was our Nursing Home residents. Many people in our community have relatives and friends in the Nursing Home and we wanted to make a place where they could all enjoy the outdoors. We live in a beautiful area and many of the residents have lived here in Wyoming for most of their lives. They enjoy the fresh air and beauty of Wyoming.

The Rotarians painted the cement wall that the flower beds were put on, they also planted flowers and put together yard furniture.

The Nursing Home residents and their families and the hospital employees and staff can take advantage of the renewed and updated courtyard at the Nursing Home. The same week that we completed the project, one of the local Nursing Home residents celebrated her 101 birthday! She was able to have her family and friends come to the Nursing Home Courtyard to celebrate with her. She had over 50 people come celebrate this huge milestone with her, this is not something that could have happened two years ago, before Kemmerer Rotary beautified the area and made it safe for residents.

6. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?  
 The Nursing Home residents are the main beneficiaries of this project. The whole idea behind this project was to get the Nursing Home residents outside for fresh air during COVID and keep them safe by putting up a fence so that they would not wander off from the hospital grounds. The Nursing Home Courtyard is now a beautiful place that the residents can go out and enjoy. Now they can have birthday parties and guests outside who come and visit them. Nursing home staff can plan outdoor activities for residents as well. We are expecting an increase in visitors to the Nursing Home with longer visits because of the accommodations that have been added.
7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?  
 The Kemmerer Rotary Club worked with the South Lincoln Hospital District and their Nursing Home to complete this project. The Kemmerer Rotary Club members worked with the hospital staff and the nursing home residents to repaint the wall, plant flowers, and put together outdoor furniture. The installation of the Nursing Home Fence was completed by the hospital maintenance crew due to security and liability issues.

When we first got quotes for the fence and the flower beds, everything was very expensive. However, because of the postponement of the project, by the time we went to buy the fencing and the flower beds the prices had dropped. The idea behind this project was to make a safe and beautiful place that the Nursing Home residents could enjoy. The cost of the fence was cut drastically and we reallocated those funds into the flower beds and yard furniture for the residents to use outside. We also added bird feeders so the residents could watch the birds and yard games for the residents to use with their families when they came to visit. This made the project overall 100 times better than what it was planned to be and we came in \$26.58 less than expected.
