## **Project Description**

- Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)?
   Three Rotary Clubs each contributed funds that was matched by District Grant Funds for a total of \$9,837. These funds provided 4,492 books plus mailing through the Dollywood Foundation for children age 0-5 living in the Verde Valley. Enrolled children receive a free, age-appropriate book each month mailed directly to their home. Enrollment varies each month, however, we are currently at 1,930 enrolled. Over 2100 children were served last year.
- 2. When (dates) and where (city, state and country) did project activities take place?
  - July 1, 2021 January 31, 2022; ongoing; Cottonwood, Camp Verde, Clarkdale, Rimrock, Cornville, Sedona, Village of Oak Creek, Jerome, Arizona
- 3. Who were the beneficiaries? The Verde Valley Imagination Library (VVIL) currently serves 1,930 children ages 0-5 in the Verde Valley and Sedona. These children receive an age appropriate book each month in the mail from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. The VVIL promotes this program to the children of the Verde Valley in various ways, in order to increase the enrollment. We enroll children at libraries, the local hospital when children are born, and local preschools.
- 4. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 15+
- 5. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Rotarians from all four local clubs have served on the VVIL Board. Rotarians have also assisted in Fundraising/Sponsorships.
- 6. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 1,950-2000 children and their families
- 7. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? The Imagination Library improves kindergarten readiness for children enrolled in the program. Assuring kindergarten readiness has a huge impact on future school success. The program will continue to promote literacy in babies and young children. The program will help to improve reading levels in our community as children attend school.

Cooperating organizations include Northern Arizona Healthcare's Verde Valley Medical Center OB nurses, community libraries, Head Start Preschools, other local preschools, local school districts, home visitation programs; all provided promotional materials to students and community members and helped to sign up the children if this was requested
