1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries
These funds were used to support the Stepping Stones Program of Crittenton Services for Children and Families in Fullerton which places transitional aged foster youth into housing and supports them in attaining skills for independent living. Crittenton Services rents apartments yet is in need of funds for furniture, lamps, decorative items, kitchen goods, bedding, hygiene products, and cleaning supplies for these homes so these youth can cook and clean for good health and brighter futures. Our Club used the DDG funds for the purchase of household goods to provide basic furnishings of the kitchen, dining room, living room, two bedrooms, and two bathrooms. On Friday, September 17, 2021 three members of our club moved the items in with the help of two members of Crittenton Services: the Lead Social Worker and the CEO. It was great to meet them and learn more about their many projects.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 3 Rotarians

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. They set up the kitchen with the dishes, flatware, cups, and pots and pans. They arranged the furniture in all of the rooms and hung inspirational decorative items and posters.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? The apartment is to be shared by two young women who have aged out of the foster system. They are now in community college and have part-time jobs.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? This furnished apartment with Crittenton Services co-signing the rental lease and partially covering the rent will allow these two young women the base from which to continue their journey into adulthood with support that should help them be successful and eventually become self-sufficient.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? Crittenton Services has vendors that give it good value for appliances and furnishings. The Social Worker from Crittenton Services used that vendor to buy the refrigerator, furniture, and furnishings.
