Project Title: Malayika Rescue Mission 5

Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? Malayika Rescue Mission (MRM) supported the educational and day-to-day expenses of eight underprivileged children in Kampala, Fort Portal and a few other communities in Uganda. In previous years there were almost 50 students attending three primary and nine secondary schools with MRM. However, with the Pandemic, increases in tuition and a drop in available funds, to match our resources current enrollment was reduced to eight students in four secondary schools..

Grant monies pay most tuition expenses to include transportation, uniforms, school supplies, personal hygiene items, toiletries, medical supplies, writing paper and dictionaries. Cash payments (Uganda schillings) from this grant to the four schools were made by MRM staff in Uganda for the First (Winter) and Second (Spring) term tuitions and schools supplies purchased locally in Kampala. The Matching Grant combined with club funds totaling \$6,500 were deposited in Comerica Bank in Bedford and transferred by wire to Postbank Uganda Ltd. in Kampala, UG.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 4

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. Jollie Kahunde directly supervised and monitored the staff of three in Uganda in administering the program on site. She communicated with schools to discuss admissions and expenses, negotiate fees and check student performance and attendance. Int'l Chair Bill Bracken prepared the grant proposal and presented to the Pacesetters Board for approval, handled bank deposit and wire transfers and donated \$500 to support the club portion of the grant. Treasurer Reggie Parr received district funds, issued \$6,500 club check to Malayika combining \$3,000 district funds with \$3,500 club matching funds.

4. How many Non-Rotarians participated in the project? 8

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The long term benefits include providing a high school education to children who otherwise likely would not have attended school, providing enhanced job options. MRM not only paid tuition but provided uniforms and clothing, school supplies, personal hygiene items, toiletries, medical supplies, writing paper and dictionaries plus food and housing. The results were an improved standard of living and health in the community with focus on girls and young women. Rotary International's Areas of Focus in Basic Education and Literacy, Disease Prevention and Treatment, plus Maternal and Child Health were supported.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? MRM Board of Directors in Texas to manage MRM, four secondary private schools in Uganda to provide facilities and curriculum and two retail stores In Uganda with inventory where school supplies and other necessities were purchased.
