Project Title: Peace Pavilion Improvements

Project Description: This project was conducted to solve several challenges with the use of our Peace Pavilion (build in 2014-15): the lack of proper irrigation for tree and plant maintenance, having a proper sound system for club and community events. These improvements were all needed in order to properly host several upcoming events – the 5440 District Conference and the 50th Club Anniversary and for the continued use of the Pavilion and Park by the community.

 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place?
Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

In cooperation with the City of Steamboat Springs, the electrical and irrigation system was improved and a bench (honoring a founding member of our club) was replaced. New signage for the Rotary Park boardwalk was designed and installed. Volunteer help from about 20 club Rotarians, trimmed trees, painted kiosks and benches and planted new landscaping. A new sound system and generator was purchased, as well as new peace paver materials and a new Rotary Display Tent. About 100 District Rotarians and guests attended the Wine Tasting District Conference Event and the 50th Anniversary is currently being planned (which will include Past Rotarians, Current Rotarians, and community members.) The Rotary Park and Pavilion is now in beautiful shape for future events and for its popular use by the community all year.

Trimmed trees, cleared debris, painted kiosks, planted new landscaping.
5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? **About 20 during the District Conference Wine Tasting Event. Countless community members and visitors visit the Rotary Park and Peace Pavilion each year.**

Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project? **The Rotary Park and Peace Pavilion is ranked as one of the most visited sites by the Steamboat Springs Chamber of Commerce. It will continue to be used by both the community and the Rotary club for many years to come!**
7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role? **The City of Steamboat Springs helped with solving the irrigation challenge, installed a new bench, and a new Rotary Park Maintenance Agreement (MOU) was adopted.**

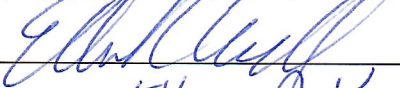
