- 2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

The Lawa Prasad Orphanage is located in a semi-rural area near Kathmandu. It is home to 21 children from the lowly Dalit caste, a deprived community group commonly known as "untouchables." The kids are from remote areas of eastern Nepal and are victims of the civil war that raged from 1996 to 2006. Prior to this project the kitchen was largely open to the elements and comprised a single rice cooker, a couple of ancient frying pans, and a few bowls and plates. The project installed a water purifying system and a sanitary and efficient kitchen. It provides potable water; food storage and preparation equipment and utensils; and enough bowls and plates for all the children. With this kitchen the orphanage is now able to prepare nutritional meals that enhance the orphans' general health and their ability to advance in school.
