WHAT IS FTEN?

We are a network for foster youth forging connections with adults who will become their employers/mentors and will stick with them through the ups and downs of growing up. Teaching them the necessary survival skills and how to built relationships as adults. A network who will provide a job/paid internship to allow the youth to have work experience in a controlled environment, where they can make mistakes under the supervision professionals. Youth through the interview process and learn the skills necessary to hold down a job. The mentor/employer helps the youth work out the rough edges so their first work experience is a successful one.

Our Story...


Each year 20,000 people age out of the U.S. foster care system. Many of these youth are only 18 and do not have the experience, resources or access to services to live independently. Most have not had a meaningful connection with a caring adult role model in years. They often find themselves unexpectedly alone, in legal trouble, or even homeless.
