## **Project Description**

1. Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)? Provided 150 Cuddle Bags to Foster and At-Risk Youth as they transition through the foster care system. OCJ Kids provides a Cuddle Bag, through the DCS case workers, to give to the at-risk children as they are being removed from neglectful or abusive situations. When a child is being removed from these situations, there is chaos and trauma involved in the removal. The cuddle bag gives the child something to hold and helps ease the trauma during the removal process and transition into foster care.

From November 2023 through March 2024 in Phoenix, Arizona in the United States of America.

Who were the beneficiaries? 150 Foster and At- Risk Youth who were removed from neglectful or abusive situations as they moved into the foster care system. Additional beneficiaries are the DCS workers who are equipped with the Cuddle Bags to hand out to help ease the trauma and chaos during the removal process.
