stop bleeding in the e	vent of traumatic injury including tourniquet use and bandaging. Students practiced on mannequins and live were introduced to Rotary and volunteer opportunities with Interact and Rotaract. The training was followed by

assembly of 120 first aid and disaster kits by Rotarians and high school students for donation to low income families via the South County

Outreach food bank.

Irvine Rotary presented the "Stop the Bleed" training to high school students.

Rotarians participated in the preparation of first aid and disaster materials to be assembled with high school students, collaborated with Orange County Fire Authority to obtain disaster preparedness materials, helped the District Interact team set up a presentation table to attract high school students to Interact, acted as live patients for the practice of first aid techniques, aligned various community agencies to present disaster preparedness opportunities to students and helped assemble and deliver first aid kits and prepare notes of inspiration for families who receive the first aid/disaster supplies.

- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

This is the second year of this project which is expanding and creating connections between numerous City of Irvine organizations and Rotary/Interact. Students life long first aid techniques and disaster preparedness which will benefit themselves, their families and victims who sustain cuts, hemorrhaging, etc. for their whole lives and learn about opportunities to support their community in the event of a major disaster. Low income households obtain crucial first aid and disaster kits which help their families survive in the event of a natural disaster.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Orange County Fire Authority – Provided the "Stop the Bleed" presentation and Disaster Preparedness Materials and first aid practice supplies, including mannequins for student practice.

MT SAC Paramedic Academy Graduates – Provided hands on first aid training to stop bleeding including training using bandaging techniques, tourniquets, compression techniques, etc.

Concordia University – Provided nursing students for help in hands on first aid training

Irvine Police Department/CERT – Provided high school students with opportunities to take teen CERT disaster preparedness classes

City of Irvine HYSAT (High School Youth Action Team) – Provided location for venue and high school and middle school student volunteers and students to take the "Stop the Bleed" class

City of Irvine Mayor Farrah Khan's office - Provided short presentation re: the importance of keeping families safe and supporting rescue efforts to high school students

UCI Rotaract – Represented Rotaract opportunities to high school students.

Rotary District 5320 Interact District governor, Interact students and District 5320 youth leadership team – Set up an informational table and provided high school students with information about Rotaract and provided safety whistle keychains, limited amount of Starbucks gift cards and a Disaster Supply checklists to students attending the event.

Irvine Rotary - Planning, funding and Collaboration of project - Liaison will all other groups

Rotary District 5320 - District Governor Nominee provided education about opportunities in Interact clubs for interested students.

South County Outreach - Recipient of the first aid kits and providing distribution to low income households through its food pantry.
