Project Title:Eyeglasses for Villagers
Project Description: About half the population of Nepal - or 11 million people - live on less than \$5/day. Also, 13 of the 77 districts in the country have no eyecare facilities and no eyecare professionals. This lack of eyecare resources, the geographic challenges, and the poor infrastructure make distribution of eyeglasses either too costly for such a poor country or altogether impossible.  This project is designed to fill that gap. It will provide eye exams to 4,240 people in the seven villages where RAW has rebuilt schools. It will give customized corrective prescription glasses to the approximately 900 students and adults that we anticipate will need them.  Sudip Koirala will lead the project. He is a leading Rotarian in Nepal who has managed RAW projects across the country for more than a decade. He also is the Nepal Country Director for DOT Glass a privately held company based in Czech Republic. He and his team have been trained by DOT and have been providing DOT eyeglasses in Nepal for more than a year.  Each pair of customized eyeglasses costs \$7.50. All testing is free and no travel costs for the team to the remote fitting sites will be charged.  For more information about DOT and its eyeglasses see https://www.dotglasses.org/home/.

2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place?

Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

In 14 schools in select villages in the Sindhuli and Ramechhap districts of Nepal, our team tested the eyesight of 4,745 people comprise of 2,582 students along with 2,163 of their parents. 211 students were identified with poor vision and were provided with prescription eyeglasses on the spot. Additionally, 689 adults received adjustable and non-breakable prescription eyeglasses tailored to their needs. 87 of the adults tested were found to have cataracts. A team from DOT Glasses performed free cataract surgeries for them in Sindhuli.
