1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Our Rotary Club of Mission Viejo partnered with Rise Against Hunger to package 18,000 nutritious meals to help combat global hunger. The hands-on service event took place on March 15, 2025, at the Norman P. Murray Community and Senior Center, located at 24932 Veterans Way, Mission Viejo, CA 92692. Over 150 Rotary members, local volunteers, Interactors and high school students participated in assembling the meals. The packaged meals were distributed to undernourished children and families in developing countries, directly supporting food-insecure communities and contributing to long-term sustainability goals.

The 18,000 packaged meals benefited approximately 135 non-Rotarian volunteers who participated in the service event, as well as an estimated 18,000 individuals internationally who received the meals, based on Rise Against Hunger's formula of each meal providing essential nutrition for one person. The primary beneficiaries were undernourished children and families in vulnerable communities across developing nations.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The project fosters greater awareness and engagement within our local community around global hunger issues, inspiring ongoing volunteerism and service. Internationally, the 18,000 meals contribute to improved health, nutrition, and stability for vulnerable populations, particularly children, helping to break cycles of poverty and malnutrition. Additionally, partnerships like this strengthen global solidarity and reinforce Rotary's mission of humanitarian service and peace-building across borders.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

Rise Against Hunger was the primary cooperating organization for this project. They provided the food supplies, logistical coordination, and technical expertise necessary to organize and implement the meal-packaging event. Their team facilitated set-up, training, and quality control throughout the day to ensure the meals met international distribution standards. Additionally, they managed the international shipping and delivery of the packaged meals to communities in need. Local volunteers and community groups also joined as participants, assisting with meal assembly under Rotary and Rise Against Hunger's guidance.
