1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
The scholarships were awarded at 3 of the 5 high schools in early June. The remaining 2 schools, Trabuco High School and Silverado High School, have been scheduled on June 22nd and June 23rd, respectively. Different Rotarians were selected to present the checks at each school. The presentations took place at the school graduation awards ceremonies. The recipients, chosen by the schools themselves, were the beneficiaries. We are submitting the Final Report in advance of the 2 remaining presentations to meet the deadline of June 15th for eligibility to apply for a District Grant for Rotary Year 2015-16. A separate scholarship to a current student at Saddleback College was presented on June 3, 2015. We are providing a copy of the canceled check.
2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
7
3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
During April, a Rotarian visited each of the 5 high schools to make arrangements to present scholarship checks at their awards ceremonies. A different Rotarian attended each of the awards ceremonies to present the checks.
4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
The scholarships will assist 10 high school seniors with paying for higher education and one Saddleback College student with continuing her education.
5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?
College expenses have been accelerating for many years. Students are graduating from college encumbered with debt. Our scholarship program eases this burden from students graduating from high school and entering college.
6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?
High school Counselors at each of the schools selected the recipients and arranged for them to receive them at the Senior Awards Program. The Saddleback College Foundation selected a recipient from that school and matched our check with \$500 additional.

Because we were required to make the scholarship checks out to the colleges or universities to which the graduating seniors were going, we do not as yet have the canceled checks back as receipts. We will add them to the file as they are cashed. The attached schedule shows the recipients, the dates of presentation, names of the Rotarian presenters, the check numbers, and the institutions to which the checks were made out. In the case students enrolling in Saddleback College, we provided 2 \$500 checks, instead of one \$1,000 check. This was done because \$500 covers tuition, and the second check could be used for books and supplies.


