Progress Report Final Report

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Rotary Club of Whittier provided 5 days of oral health education and nutrition days at elementary schools in the Whittier City School providing free dental screenings, fluoride treatment, oral health and nutrition education, and referral to care to low income elementary age children. Every participant received an oral health kit comprised of a toothbrush, tooth paste, floss, timer and educational material (in English or Spanish). Oral Health Days: Three at Sorenson Elementary School (Mondays Jan 25, Feb 1 and Feb 8th.) and Longfellow Elementary School (Thursdays, January 28 and February 4th).

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?
 90 % of club members participated in the oral health days.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Entered classrooms to present on and distribute oral health kits. Other Rotarians were present on the final days for each school to hand out the oral health kits to all students.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

1,115 elementary age students

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

1,115 elementary age students in 41 classrooms participated in a 31 minute Oral Health Education and Oral Health Presentation, all students received Oral Health Kits, and Oral Health Information in English and Spanish. 265 students who returned permission slips received dental screenings and fluoride varnish. 43% of children who were screened needed dental work, 3% in need of urgent dental care. These children were provided with referrals for free or low-cost dental care.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Children's Dental Health Clinic of Long Beach provided the dental expertise i.e. dental educators & dental hygienist.
