This project would help fulfill the sanitation needs of girl students who study in the selected government girls higher secondary school located in Aranthangi town situated in the revenue district of Pudukkottai in the State of Tamil Nadu.

As of the official record available at the school , the student strength of the school during the academic year 2020-21 is 1587. 37 Female teachers and 9 male teachers are available as faculty members.

45% of students live in rural areas where the primary schools alone are available. They have totravel from their respective villages every day to attend their upper primary, secondary and higher secondary school education at Aranthangi. The Government Girls Higher Secondary School at Aranthangi serves the town of Aranthangi and 52 surrounding villages with a total population of around 146,748 people.

The data submitted is as per the 2011 census. We can expect the numbers to have increased by around

10% by now.

Therefore, based this interview, it was determined that if their requirements were fulfilled, the hygiene and sanitation will greatly improve inside the school campus as existing facilities are grossly inadequate.

How would your project's activities accomplish this goal?

By constructing an Integrated sanitation complex, the sanitation needs of 1500+ girls students will be fulfilled as they will have access to hygienic toilets and hand wash stations

What challenges have prevented the community from accomplishing the project's goals?

Lack of immediate funds at the School and the time it takes to cut through the red tape to urgently construct the facilities has played a major role in this School not having sufficient quantity of the needed Sanitation facilities.
