By supplying water sanitation equipment, they will be able to produce drinking water for their operation, as well as to sell drinking water to the community and with the funds generated contribute to their sustainability. At the same time, installing the Laundromat equipment, will be another source of income. All of these will allow them to increase the number of children and services they will be able to offer to the community in need..

What challenges have prevented the community from accomplishing the project's goals?

Lack of funds, either from government agencies or the families.

How is the community addressing these challenges now?

So far the support has been coming from the personal resources of the institution director, Patricia Ramirez and the Water Cup Foundation. These resources are limited, and that is why making the institution sustainable is a must.

Why are the project's activities the best way to meet this community need?

Because volunteers and future employees, are members of the community and they are very aware that by them operating the equipment appropriately they will guarantee the continuity of the benefits the entire community receives from the institution.
