## Mobile Emergency Hospitals

To remedy the problem of bombed / destroyed hospitals in eastern Ukraine. In many areas close to the front, the health service has collapsed as the local health care services are destroyed.

To remedy this, **mobile emergency clinics** are being produced that will act as mobile emergency room for injured people.

Those clinics are not intended to handle complicated operations, but minor injuries.

An estimated **80% of the injured will be able to be treated in the clinics.**

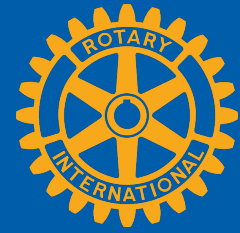

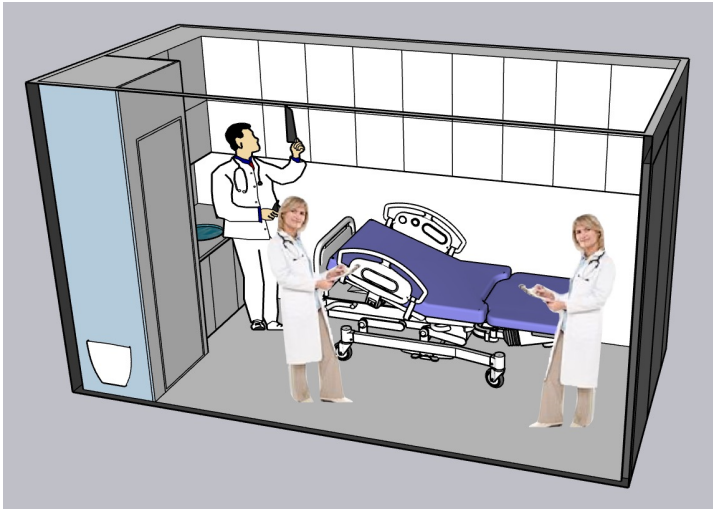

*"The units will be multi-functual to take victims from the war both as injured and women who has been a victim of abuse, etc."*

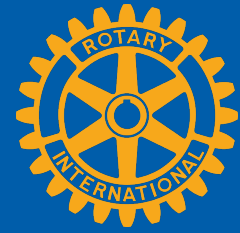
*"Normal check up on health can be done in the units."*

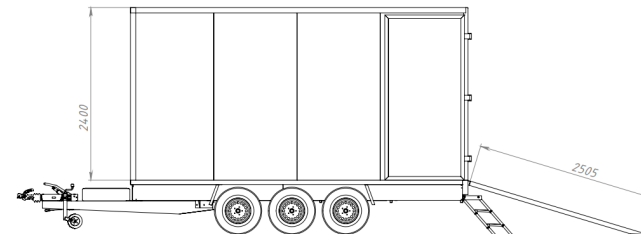
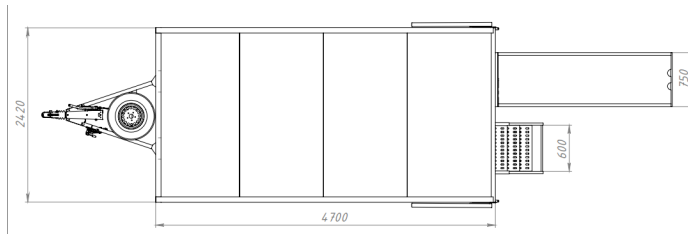
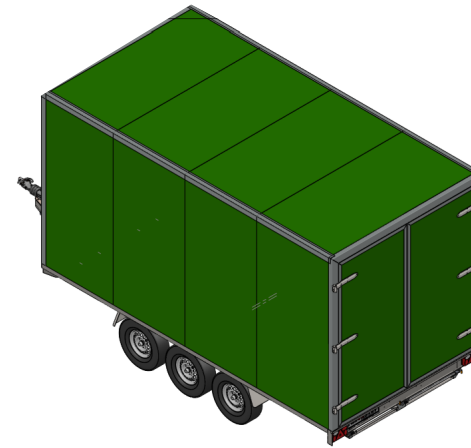
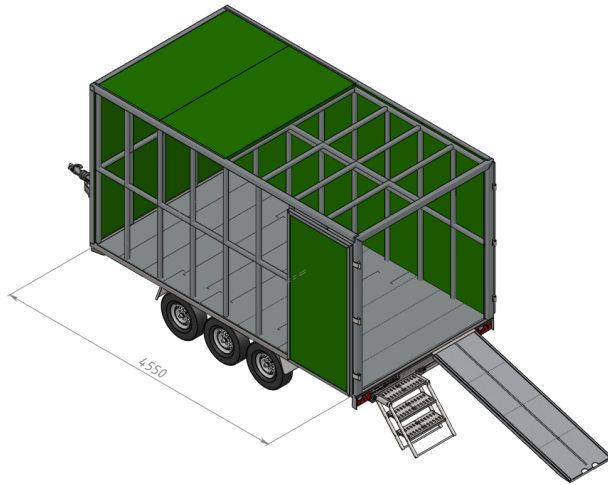
The mobile hospital



Designed to stay directly in the war zone



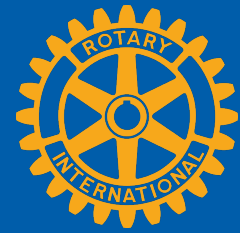

- Strong metal construction to take a small blast nearby (bombing area).
- Fire resistant 50 mm isolated walls for summer and winter use.
- Special anker system to keep the unit steady.

## Timeline - Mobile Emergency Hospitals.



**Delivery time:** 45 days after payment.

## Basic Equipment installed:

- 7,5 kW generator support to ensure full 24/7 operation.
- Fully operational electric system with backup.
- Water cleaning system\* to provide clean drinking water to population in the area.
- Emergency hospital equipment is used up to 10 years old.

## Proposed Equipment for medical clinics:

- Table for examination of the patient
- Cardiograph
- Portable Ultrasound
- Otoscope
- Tonometers
- Tablet medicines
- Analyzers for blood, sugar levels, etc.
- Various tests (coding, hepatitis, HIV / AIDS)
- Phonendoscopes
- Surgical kit
- If possible, a dental chair

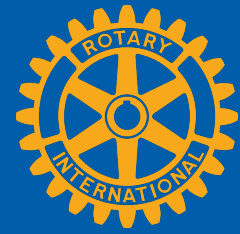
